UPDATE - Prep Honor Roll Dinner

Jean and I had a good meeting Tuesday and she mentioned you may want to expand the scope beyond just sports. Here are a few thoughts in that regard.

First of all, the WHERE, WHEN and HOW of the dinner is identical, whether you choose to honor athletes, scholar athletes, or just scholars, the mechanics of the dinner are the same.

Second, the WHY of the dinner will be necessary to sell the idea to potential sponsors and donors. Convincing the schools to participate will also require the development of a coherent apolitical vision.

Finally, the WHO is the tricky part. I would encourage maintaining an empirical approach, at least on your part, when determining the invitees and honorees. To the extent that the subjective decisions are deferred to the schools will provide you with, in the words of Col. North, "plausible deniability."

Here are some potential groups to target. Please forgive me as I am using the 1981 edition of Quetzal (official yearbook of Esperanza High School) as a reference for some of the relevant awards:

- Top male and female athlete of the year
- Scholar/Athlete Award (named for local alum killed after graduation)
- National Honor Society Scholarship
- Valedictorian and Salutatorian

Some other choices could include establishing the following criteria:

- 1) Highest GPA with a minimum letter in one sport (empirical and all schools would send a male and female winner);
- 2) Minimum letter in one sport and a National Merit Scholar (much smaller set and many schools would have no representatives);
- 3) Honor the captain of the team with the highest cumulative GPA (empirical and would send a male and female winner);

4) Highest SAT or ACT scores with a minimum letter in one sport (empirical and all schools would send a male and female winner);

The next logical follow-up would be to survey each high school to determine if there is a commonality in the honoring of students.

In the mean time, meeting with Bill Habermehl to get his assistance would be a good start. In addition, we should plan to meet with the editors of the OC Register Sports to determine their willingness to participate. If they choose to not to participate, you will have more freedom to expand the coverage.

The key perspective to keep in mind is tying it back to the archives. Selecting something too exotic and new will render the historic aspect moot. With some of the high schools spanning 100 years and more, it may be difficult to find a common denominator with present criteria. A potential solution would be to pick a time in history—the introduction of the valedictorian and salutatorian, SAT, GPA calculations, etc. and start from that point forward and document the history. Anything prior to that point in time could be determined by a blue ribbon commission of historians, who would set those standards for OC history.

There is a hybrid possibility. Determine which group (1-4 above) you want to honor and also have the OC Register honor the top male and female athletes of the year. There may or may not be overlap in the groups.

The key, ideally, will be to keep the number of preps being honored to two per school. Otherwise it creates a doubling of the logistics and support/donations required.

Let me know of your thoughts in this regard and how you would like to proceed.
